

Dear Families:

Your child's school is taking part in a very important project to understand health issues among students in Springfield. This initiative is a collaborative effort of Springfield Public Schools, the Public Health Institute of Western Massachusetts, the Gandara Center's Stop Access Coalition, Springfield Youth Mental Health Coalition, Springfield Health and Human Services, and MA Gaming Commission.

All students in 8th, 10th, and 12th grade will be asked to complete an online questionnaire addressing many health topics. The questionnaire is based off a standard set of questions being asked of youth throughout the state. Questions address many health issues including substance use, in school and out of school activities, social media usage, exposure to bullying and violence, and coping with stress. A copy of the questionnaire will be posted on the Springfield Public Schools website at www.springfieldpublicschools.com. The questionnaire is completely confidential, and there is no way to link answers back to individual students. The survey will be given online during one class period at school from October 15 through October 25.
